Dear Mr. Toomey:

This responds to your request dated July 30, 2008, to the Department of Justice (DOJ), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act/ Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) for information concerning the Joan Webster murder case. The FBI referred a copy of your request and two documents consisting of five pages to the Interpol-U.S. National Central Bureau (USNCB). We received your request on March 10, 2009. Please refer to the above FOIA number assigned to your request in any additional correspondence.

Of the five (5) pages referred to the USNCB for review and direct response to you, we have determined that one (1) page can be released with partial deletions pursuant to Title 5, United States Code, Section 552 (b)(2), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(D) of the FOIA. The remaining four (4) pages are being withheld in the entirety pursuant to Title 5, United States Code, Section 552 (b)(7)(D) of the FOIA. Exemption (b)(2) applies to material related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency. Exemption (b)(7)(C) of the FOIA relates to records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information, if disclosed, could reasonably be expected to constitute an invasion of personal privacy. Exemption (b)(7)(D) provides protection for records or information that could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, including a state, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of a record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation. The withheld pages contain non-exempt information, which cannot be reasonably segregated from the deleted information.

You must make your appeal in writing and it must be received by the Office of Information and Privacy within 60 days of the date of the letter denying your request. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
